HERE'S WHY IT MATTERS

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE ABFAS BOARD CERTIFIED?

1 EDUCATION AND RESIDENCY

After completing an undergraduate degree and four years of doctoral training at a podiatric medical college, a podiatrist will participate in a multi-year residency program to obtain clinical experience as a foot and ankle surgeon.

2 THE BOARD CERTIFICATION PROCESS

Residents in their final year of residency training initiate the board certification process by taking a thorough didactic exam (written) and a computer-based patient simulation exam. A candidate who passes these exams becomes ABFAS Board Qualified and is eligible for board certification.

The final step in ABFAS Board Certification is a comprehensive review of a sample of the candidate's actual surgical cases. Once candidates successfully complete this part of the process, they become ABFAS Board Certified and earn the esteemed title of Diplomate.



To maintain board certification, ABFAS Diplomates must participate in the LEAD Continuous Certification Program, assessing their knowledge and skills throughout the year and demonstrating a career-long commitment to learning the latest advancements in podiatric surgery and patient care.

Diplomates also must obtain continuing medical education credits through educational activities and provide proof of current active surgical privileges at a hospital or surgery center.
