Featured FAQ: ITEs vs. Final-year ITEs



Exams and ABFAS Final-Year In-Training Exams?

Q: What is the difference between ABFAS In-Training

A: ABFAS administers annual In-training Examinations (ITE) and Final-year ITEs in the Fall to assess residents' progress of training and education during their residency. There are four ITEs/Final-year ITEs offered: Foot Surgery Didactic, Foot Surgery CBPS, RRA Surgery Didactic, RRA Surgery CBPS.

Residents who are not yet in their final year take the ABFAS ITEs during a six-day examination window (Sept. 16-21, 2024). While they will take CBPS exams in-person at Pearson VUE testing centers, they may choose to take the didactic exams online or in-person.

Non-final-year residents will receive their ITE exam results 6-8 weeks after the exam window via PRR. The exam report will include their score, as well as the mean score for all PGY-1 and PGY-2 residents.



These exams are comparable to ABFAS Part I Board Qualification Exams, and final-year residents who pass any individual Final-year ITE may use that score toward fulfilling their Board Qualification exam requirements. Final-year ITE exam results are available in PRR 6–8

Final-year residents take their Final-year ITEs on two

pass/fail only. Residents who do not pass a Final-year ITE can download a score report, which includes numeric scaled scores, from their ABFAS profile.




